POPULATION, PATIENT, PHYSICIAN AND PROFESSIONALISM (P4)

P4 is a Year 1 course that will emphasize the interconnected-ness of the evolving professional identity of a physician connected to patients and populations. For the 21st century, physicians must be competent in not only Basic Sciences (e.g., biochemistry, anatomy, physiology) and Clinical Sciences (e.g., physical examination, patient communication, and clinical diagnosis), but also in Health Systems Science, a science that complements Basic and Clinical Sciences. Health Systems Science includes subject areas such as population health management, behavioral and social determinants of health, health systems improvement, and value-based care.

The P4 course exposes students to their roles as clinician, leader, interprofessional collaborator, scholar and systems analyst through large group sessions, small group sessions, online modules, self-directed reflective assignments, and clinical opportunities in the community.

We are seeking individuals who would like to contribute the professional development of our students by leading a small group session. Small Group leaders will help formulate the ideas mentioned above by facilitating discussions, providing feedback on reflective pieces, and evaluating student development.

Professional development training will be offered throughout the course.
