Getting Started with Respondus 4.0 (v 1.2)

What is it?

Respondus 4.0 is a tool that allows faculty to create quizzes and exams. Exams can be stored, modified, printed or published directly to Canvas.

Faculty can use Respondus to:

- Create exams with multiple question types (e.g., multiple choice, True or False, essay)
- Create a test question databank, which can be accessed anytime
- Create exams that can be scored automatically

Note: Respondus 4.0 is a Windows-only program and will not work on a Mac computer.

Downloading & Installing Respondus

Downloading Respondus

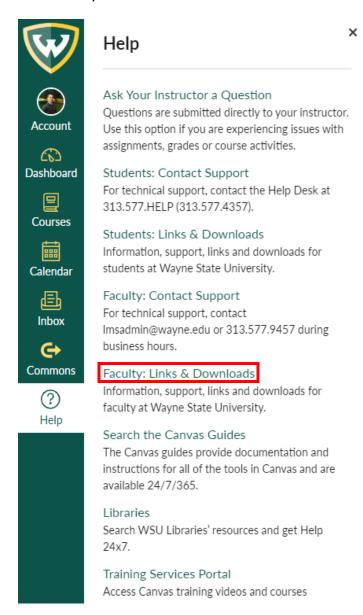
If you do not already have Respondus installed to your computer, you will need to download the software and install it. To access the download file for Respondus 4.0, follow these steps:

1. Log in to Canvas and then click on Help in the left-hand sidebar.





2. From the options that appear, choose **Faculty: Links & Downloads.** This should open a new *tab* in your browser.





3. At the bottom of the new tab under **Downloads** you will see the link for Respondus 4.0 (Test Creation & Upload Software). Click the link and the download will begin automatically.

Creating Exams and Quizzes within Respondus

Once you have downloaded Respondus 4.0, the <u>Instructor Quick-Start Guide</u> provides information about how to navigate the program, how to use the Exam Wizard tool, how to import questions from other formats (such as MS Word), and how to publish and exam.

Importing Questions into Respondus to Create Exams or Quizzes

Respondus allows you to import multiple choice, true-false, essay, fill in the blank, matching and multiple answer questions from a file. The questions must be organized in a format that is acceptable to Respondus and the file must be stored in one of the following formats:

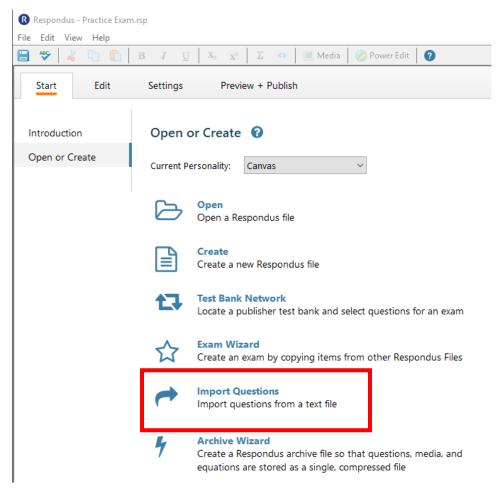


- Plain text (.txt),
- Rich-text (.rtf),
- MS Word (.doc and .docx),
- Tab/comma delimited (.csv) format,
- StudyMate Class format (.zip and .xml).

The <u>standard format for importing questions into respondus guide</u> can help you prepare word or text file for import.

Starting the Import

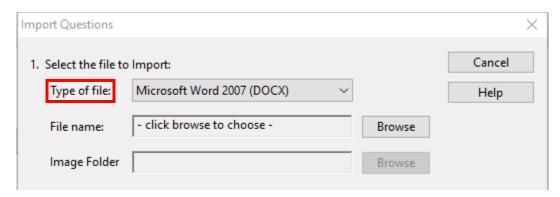
To start the import, select the **Import Questions** task from the *Start* menu.



Step 1 – Selecting the File Type

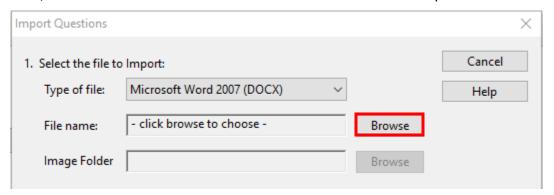
The first step is to select the **type of file** that will be imported.





Note: The <u>Standard Format</u> for organizing questions is the same for Plain Text (.txt), Rich Text (.rtf) files, and Microsoft Word (.doc and .docx) files. Files that are in rich text (.rtf) and MS Word (.doc and .docx) format will retain some of the enhanced question formatting such as bold, italic, underline, superscript, and subscript. Embedded graphics can only be imported if the file is in Microsoft Word (.doc) format, although an alternative method is available for .rtf and .txt files (see Importing Images).

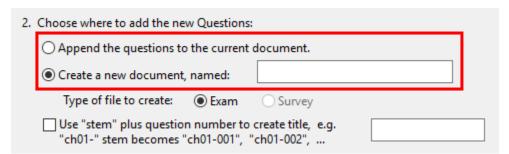
Next, use the **Browse** button to locate and select the file to be imported.



Note: Images embedded in MS Word files will import automatically. However, if images are being imported with csv, rich-text, or txt files (see Importing Images with Questions), browse to the folder that contains those images.

Step 2 – Append Questions or Create New File?

Specify whether the questions should be appended to the currently open file or whether to create an entirely new file. If you select the second option you will need to enter the name of the file to be created.



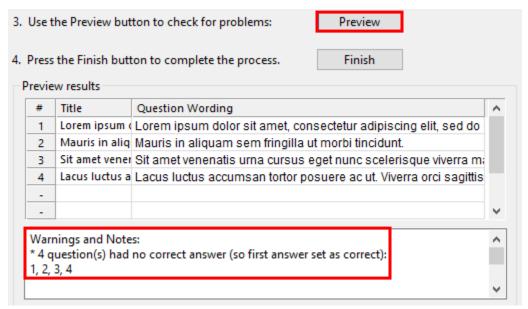


Each question being imported will have a "title". If you don't specify a title for each question in the text file itself (discussed below), Respondus will automatically use the first 20 characters of the question wording as the question title.

Alternatively, titles can be based on a specific "stem" (or string of text) which will then be followed by consecutive numbering starting with 001. For example, if you select the "Use stem..." checkbox and enter the text "Chapter1-", the title for the first question being imported will be Chapter1-001, the title for the second question will be Chapter1-002, and so on. (You are *not* required to enter a stem phrase--this feature is entirely optional.)

Step 3 – Preview Your Questions

Click the **Preview** button to preview the file being imported and to see if there are any warning messages.



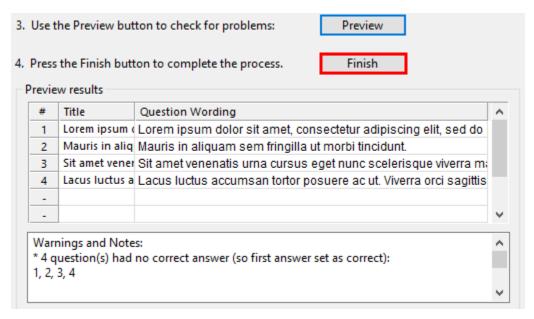
If warning messages are shown at the bottom of the screen, you need to determine whether to make changes to the text file or whether to continue with the import.

Note: Some warning messages don't actually require you to make a change to the file being imported. For instance, Respondus will generate a warning message if two questions being imported have the same title (Respondus will place the number "2" at the end of the second title to make it distinct from the first). But if you don't care about this issue, you can ignore the warning message.

Step 4 – Finishing the Import Process

If you are satisfied with how the results look in Preview, click **Finish** to complete the import. The file has now been created or appended.





Once you've imported your questions, switch to the <u>Edit menu</u> to modify the file, or go to the <u>Preview</u> tab to view the file using a browser-like window.

Tips for Creating Effective Online Exams and Quizzes

Here are some tips provided by Brown University for administering effective exams online:

- 1. Create complex questions that require deep, analytical thinking skills to complete
 - a. Consider Bloom's Taxonomy when developing questions
- 2. Use time limits for the exam availability to maintain students' focus during the exam
- 3. Allow students multiple attempts (e.g., 2) to allow for troubles with internet connectivity
- 4. Randomize questions to maximize academic integrity
